All entries must be made by 6:00pm on Wednesday. Exhibits must be in place no later than 9:00am on Thursday. Judging of flowers will start at 11:00am.

- Rule 1. All flowers must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- Rule 2. The superintendent shall have the right to remove at any time the exhibit or any part thereof which is unsightly.

- Rule 3. Flowers will be scored on (1) condition, (2) quality, (3) substance & texture (4) color intensity, (5) uniform containers.
- Rule 4. All exhibitors shall furnish clean pint or quart fruit jars for exhibits unless otherwise specified. Roses are to be exhibited in plain bud vases.
- Rule 5. An exhibitor may enter only one exhibit in any class.
- Rule 6. All exhibits must remain in place until the close of the fair.

Potted Plants

- Rule 1. All plants must have been in possession of the exhibitor for at least 60 days prior to the Pottawatomie County Fair.
- Rule 2. One container per entry, with saucers if there is a drainage hole in container. NO WATERING without a saucer.
- Rule 3. Judging will be based on color, condition, container, foliage and/or flower, correct name, culture, perfection, quality, maturity and shape.
- Rule 4. Plants must be groomed for exhibition, insect & wax free. Clean with water only.
- Rule 5. Pots over 12” in diameter WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- Rule 6. One entry per exhibitor for each class.
- Rule 7. No plant over 4 feet tall including pot, shall be entered.
- Rule 8. Ribbons will be placed on the top (5) in each class.
