1. What are three characteristics of wool?

A: it is stain resistant, easily cared for, temperature regulated, wrinkle resistant, fire resistant, takes dye easily, etc.

2. How much time should you give wool garments between wearing?

A: 24 hours in order to allow the fibers to return to their shape.

3. How do you care for wool garments?

A: always read the care label on the garment. If there is no care label

4. How should you iron wool garments?

A: Always use steam & use a wool setting (if available). Avoid pressing wool totally dry. Iron from the reverse side and use a press cloth when possible. Lower & lift iron, don't slide it back and forth.

5. What is the difference in meats called lamb and mutton?

A: Lamb is meat from sheep less than 1 year old and mutton is meat from sheep over 1 year old.

6. What are the majority of sheep raised for in the United State raised for?

A: Meat

7. Historically what were the three reasons that sheep were raised?

A: Food, Shelter and Clothing
